Papa Alf Pukepuke spent many of his years as a former policeman looking after the youth of West Auckland. He always had a passion for sports, and in his later years became heavily involved in waka ama.. He realised the potential of waka ama to develop and inspire youth. In his early waka ama career he pursued the passion he had developed for the sport locally through the Waitakere Outrigger Canoe Club and Hoani Waititi Marae and later on he set up his own club, UP2 – Unlimited Potential.

Using his nous for sports and youth Papa Alf became a major figure in promoting waka ama, not only in West Auckland but also further afield. He was a former President of Waitakere, UP2 – Unlimited Potential and the Auckland Outrigger Canoe Association. His enduring character helped to resource many up and coming paddlers to become world champions and as the face of Fai Va'a in New Zealand he enabled paddlers to receive overseas sponsorship and host many international teams. Papa Alf became recognised nationally and internationally as one of our true waka ama identities.

Papa Alf's passing last year triggered a great sense of loss, including those who loved and respected him amongst his old Waitakere whānau. His spirit endures in the thoughts and hearts of the waka ama fraternity, and his legacy of course will always remain with his whānau and wife who miss him dearly.
