# LONG DISTANCE NATIONALS MARKA ARAA

### Waitohi - Te Waka o Aoraki



### Te Whakamāramatanga o te Tohu

This design for the 2021 Long Distance National Waka Ama event being held at Waitohi (Picton), pays homage to the locations and natural history of the area.

- The 8 iwi who old mana whenua over Te Tauihu all draw spiritual essence from this place. They are represented by the 8 paddlers in the waka.
- The spout of the Blue whales in the design represents the Te Ātiawa 3 white feathers of peace. Blue whales and other baleen whales, visited these waters annually to feed on krill which cover areas so vast that the tidal flow turned red. The colour of the waka ama depicts this phenomenon. This tide is known as Kura Te Au, also the name of Tory Channel.
- Totaranui, the original name of Queen Charlotte Sound and Waitohi, are very significant wāhi to all of Te Tauihu iwi.
- The movement of the design, the uniformity of straight linear lines, depict the way these whales migrate from the breeding grounds in the Tropic of Capricorn, to the feeding grounds of the Antarctic. This is the longest migration of any mammal.
- The adult whales do not feed while in the Tropics. The new-born calves feeding from their mothers, drains their energy, which is why the journey is direct, no time for blunders or slip-ups.
- Totaranui and Kura Te Au is at the half-way mark and where they start feeding. Waka Ama racing has a similar, basic way of traversing, as quickly as possible from the start to the finish line.

The LDN races start in Waitohi waters moves into Totaranui waters and then into Kura te Au waters

### **VENUE TIKANGA**

Reusable coffee cups and water bottles are encouraged to assist with low waste, we are asking paddlers to bring your own coffee cup (though there will be cups available) AND water bottle. There will be no sale of water in plastic bottles at the site, we will have drinkable water taps available around the event site. As with all National events this is a no smoking, no vaping, no alcohol and no drug event. Please be mindful of some of the alcohol rules that may be around the marina. If you must inhale we suggest you go off site or onto the main road.

### BACK UP RACE DAY

If the weather or sea conditions make it unsafe to paddle any one of the allocated races then Sunday, 25<sup>th</sup> April 2021 is the back-up race day. Paddlers are advised to make plans to be available that day.

#### **PENALTIES & FEES**

Any late additions/changes/withdrawals after the 7<sup>th</sup>April, a \$20 per paddler late fee will apply e.g. division changes, paddler swap, additions.

There will be no late entries taken at the event.

All entry fees must be paid in full prior to racing.

Any club that withdraws teams after being invoiced will still be charged the full entry fee.





### **RACE RULES**

All entrants must be familiar with the Waka Ama New Zealand race and safety rules. Refer to the following link for more information - <u>https://wakaama.co.nz/pages/read/1005147</u>

PFD's – All J16 and Novice paddlers/Teams must wear PFD's to race.

All others must have them readily available in the waka.

Should the conditions require it – The Race Director may advise it compulsory for all paddlers to wear their PFD.

Spray Skirts: All W6 must have spray skirts and these will be required to be fitted for safety check.

**Only 1 Entry in a division** – As per the race rules: There must be a minimum of two (2) paid entries for a programmed race to be run. If there is only one entry for a race, the organising committee may combine this entry with another race, but shall inform the affected paddler or team, and in any case identify their results in relation to the programmed race.

We will be making contact with those clubs who only have 1 entry in a division to advise the new division for that paddler/team.

Please note : there are no medals awarded for divisions with only 1 entry.

The site maps shows the location of everything including the boat ramp we will be using to load out waka. All waka will be parked in the green field. Safety checks will occur in the field, where all rigging will take place. This is to reduce congestion at the boat ramp and to aid in the flow of traffic around the marina.

Attached above is a link to the parking. Disability parking will be available closer to the beach, with specified parking for para paddlers. Shelley Beach Road will be closed to traffic except for emergency vehicles, QCYC Staff and Waka Ama NZ admin, specified para parking. **Please note that there is ample free parking in the green field all other parking is paid parking.** 

### **APPENDIX E: Trailer Parking**

Note that trailer parking is also in the greenfield and a designated area is set aside for trailers. The trailer parking will be **open on Thursday from 8am till 3.45pm and then from 5pm till late.** On Friday the trailer park will be open from **3.30pm until late**. If you are arriving after 7pm please let us know so we can let security know you will be arriving late. Please email at <u>ldn@wakaama.co.nz</u>.

If you are arriving before Thursday the 23rd April also please let us know, we can arrange to have your waka stored down at the site in the greenfield but we need to know in advance. Any storage before the 23rd will not have security, except for a locked gate.
