My name is Frances Piacun, I am of Maori, Croatian, English descent and from my Paratene whanau I whakapapa back to the Te Rarawa and Te Aupouri Iwi from the Far North and I am the eldest of 8 children.

I started paddling with the Nga Hoe Horo Club in 2016, when I returned home from living internationally, and was hired to organize the Te Houtaewa Challenge on Te Oneroa a Tohe which consisted of Ultra Marathon, Marathon, Half Marathon runs and a Waka Ama Surf Challenge at Ahipara.

I still support Nga Hoe Horo Club, having donated a Trophy for Volunteer of the year and also annually prize money for rangatahi.

I have competed in Golden Master & Master 70's teams at World Sprints in Canada, Australia, Tahiti and London since I started paddling.

I have been fortunate through life to have had wonderful mentors both in business & sport and believe it is important for me to offer the same support to our Rangatahi as I get older.

My role in coming back to New Zealand was as General Manager for the 'I am Special' Youth programme and I facilitated workshops for 50 students from Secondary Schools in South Auckland and Whangarei

I moved to Queenstown in 2014, and found no Waka Ama Club, and I decided it was time to start one here.

We are a small Club but we are very active. We now have a Masters Mens team, a Masters Women's team and a J19 Girls crew.

I have introduced Waka Ama to 124x Year 7/8 Rangatahi from Arrowtown Primary, 2 mixed crews from the Alexandra Youth Justice people and am now coaching a crew of J19 girls from Wakatipu High School with the goal of going to World Sprints in 2024.

I am now also coaching their mothers, and I personally continue to train for the next Worlds as a part of the Aratika Masters 70 team.

Frances is a committed and passionate person who has spent since 2014 establishing a waka ama club in Wakatipu. as part of this she has volunteered many hours to growing rangatahi in the Queenstown-Franton area involving them in the activity, sport and culture of waka ama. In addition

to this she has represented Aotearoa at world sprints recently with Te Aratika Water Sports club. She is an accomplished business woman, who works full time.
