REPLACEMENT PADDLERS

As per the race rules, paddlers may only be removed and replaced after the heat of an event by producing a medical certificate from a registered medical practitioner or the medical first aid on site. This confirms that the paddler has been examined, and had a legitimate medical reason for not being able to paddle at that particular event and time. Replacement paddlers will need to be actioned at the admin desk onsite or email events@wakaama.co.nz

COVID-19

We understand that COVID-19 may still impact some paddlers and teams. Therefore, should a paddler test positive for COVID-19, they are not required to produce a medical certificate. They may simply send a photo of their positive test to their club coordinator, who must then come to the admin onsite and replace them with an eligible paddler from their club roster. Should the Club have to add a new paddler to their roster to replace the paddler, the late fee for this paddler will be waived. Entry fee and ID card costs will apply as required.

The paddler who tested positive for COVID-19 will not be eligible to race in any further events at the 2024 Waka Ama Sprint Nationals. The paddler must take all COVID precautions as required and isolate offsite in line with Ministry of Health rules.

CLUB TROPHIES

The Trophies were carved by Matahi Whakataka-Brightwell who has been instrumental in the re-birth and growth of the sport of Waka Ama in Aotearoa.

Waka Ama Sprint Nationals Club Points Trophy

The first is a trophy that recognises club paddling excellence and achievement throughout the week. Points will be accumulated throughout the week from all finals and the club with the most points at

the end of the week will be awarded this honour. In 2024 the trophy was again awarded to **Horouta Waka Hoe** who topped the club points for the 12th time in 13 years.



Ace Cutthers Memorial Club Spirit Award

The second trophy was carved and named in honour of Ace Cutthers who we sadly lost in 2010. It is the “Ace Cutthers Memorial Club Spirit Award”. It will be chosen by the Volunteers and Officials at the event. They will take into consideration the actions of the club throughout the week and their performance on and off the water. The club that optimises the values of waka ama.

The winning club in 2024 was **Te Pou Herenga Waka**. As a club they embodied the values of Waka Ama throughout the event - Manaakitanga, Whanaungatanga, Hauora, Tū Tangata. A true reflection of all working together as one.

REGIONAL AND CLUB TENTS



Tents cannot be erected on-site until **midday Friday, January**

12th.

Please note - as per the image above, these areas are prohibited for tent placement:

1. The entire hill behind the tower to the road and Don Rowlands Centre car park
2. Directly in front of the Podium Cafe
3. 10m pathway along the lakefront of the spectator bank
4. The walkways through the spectator area.

Any tents placed in these prohibited areas will be asked to move

If you have paid a company to erect your club/regional tent please ask them to check in at the admin area (Don Rowlands Centre) when they arrive onsite and before erecting any tents. They can also contact Aroha (021 809 845) or Lara (027 5484612) for assistance on the day.


SPECTATOR EMBANKMENT

Regions are to coordinate their space and ensure tents are erected in such a way that it maximises space and viewing for everyone. (The short side of the tents must face the lake). We will be marking out an area of the spectator bank on Friday 10th (parallel with the lake) that must be kept clear of all tents, structures or marques. This is to allow for safe walking passages. It will look something like this:

Please remember that any tents or pop up structures erected on the sloping embankment will need to be put down for prize giving each day. If tents (club or otherwise) are erected in the wrong area or in such a way that it does not maximise space we will ask that they be taken down.

PARKING

There will be no access to the lower road every day, between half an hour before the first race call (See race schedule) and after 5 pm, excluding emergency and service vehicles.

There is no parking within the race venue. All vehicles are required to **access parking through Gate 3** for \$5 per vehicle per day.

WEEKLY PARKING PASSES

Week-long Parking Passes are available for \$25. Week-long passes must be displayed on the vehicle's dashboard for clear viewing and must include the vehicle registration number.

Week-long passes will be available for purchase from the Admin Desk at the Don Rowlands Centre and online at the Waka Ama shop <https://waka-ama-nz-shop.myshopify.com/> until 5pm Saturday 11th.

After 5 pm on Saturday you will need to purchase directly from the Admin on Sunday.

(Week passes will not be available for purchase at the gate or after Sunday). Any online purchases (other than merchandise) need to be collected from the Admin Desk inside the Don Rowlands Centre.

DISABLED PARKING

Disabled Parking is through Gate 3, the parking spaces are located in the drop-off zone and passes must be displayed at all times.

WAKA USE

All W6 waka are kindly loaned by clubs and our Waka Fleet Partner Te Wānanga o Aotearoa. Any team causing damage to any W6/W12 waka at any time during the event will incur the cost of the repairs, which will be charged to the team's club. Please respect the Waka and treat them as you would if they were your own. All contracted W6 waka are to be used solely for competition. No contracted waka may be taken or used for training purposes while contracted to the event. This non-permitted use will incur a fine to the offender's club of \$200 per incident.

WAKA FLEET PARTNER

WASTE MINIMISATION

The Mighty River Domain is continuing to work towards operating as a “Zero Waste” site.

- There will be a large **Waste “Sort yourself” Minimisation Station** set up along Vendor Lane.
- All clubs, paddlers, and spectators will sort their own waste when arriving at the Station.
- There will be large skip bins labelled for flattened cardboard and plastic bottles / cans.
- There will be large wheelie bins labelled for glass and food waste.
- There will be smaller wheelie bins labelled for general waste.
- The station will be manned each day from 8am - 5pm (or until 30 mins after the last race), by a group of Kaitiāo (Volunteers), to ensure patrons use the correct bins for their waste.
- Bins will be monitored regularly and emptied by venue staff as required
- There **will not** be the capacity to remove broken umbrellas, broken chairs or gazebos, chilly bins, or other large items, so please must take these with you when leaving
- Clubs will not be issued with black rubbish bags, or individual rubbish boxes.
- Please encourage your teams to bring a **refillable drink bottle** to fill from the water stations.
- Please encourage whanau to bring a **reusable keep cup for hot/cold drinks at vendor sites**
- Recycling stations will still be set up around the venue for glass, plastic, cans and food scraps



We remind everyone as kaitiaki to reduce, recycle and reuse as much as possible at the 2025 Waka Ama Nationals and work with the Mighty River Domain operating as a “Zero Waste” site.

W1 RACE DAY

IMPORTANT – PLEASE SHARE THIS INFORMATION WITH ALL W1 PADDLERS AND MANAGERS

Waka Drop off

- **4 - 7 pm - Tuesday, January 14th** - there will be access for W1 paddlers to head out on the race course after prizegiving
- **6 - 7 am - Wednesday, January 15th** - there will be **NO** access for W1 paddlers to head out on the race course
- **W1 must only be dropped off at the allocated times above**
- Drop off access is via Gate 1 and exit via Gate 2
- Space will be marked out for each region - check with your regional coordinator
- Your W1 is your responsibility.
- Bring your bungs for your waka and look after them.
- A limited supply of number holders will be onsite and can be purchased from the admin building for \$5 each. Please bring your own duct tape.
- Number Holders can be ordered online - <https://waka-ama-nz-shop.myshopify.com/>
- There will be access to the race course for W1s after the prizegiving on Tuesday 14th – **there will be no lake access on Wednesday morning.**

Pre Race

- W1 Waka must all weigh a minimum of 14kgs (fully rigged)
- We will not be weighing all W1 Waka before the racing - **It is your responsibility to ensure that your waka weighs 14kg when you race.**
- We will have the scales set up during drop off and before racing and you are welcome to weigh your waka yourself on our official scales to check its weight
- You are responsible for ensuring your waka has weights in it when you race if it needs weighing up
- There is no restriction to the amount or type of W1 that can be used for this event.
- Hull, Ama and Kiato will be weighed and must weigh a minimum of 14kgs

W1 Weighing Process - post race

- The first 3 Waka in each race will be weighed by dedicated Kaitūao when they come off the water at the end of their race
- The dedicated Kaitūao will let paddlers know as they arrive back into the loading bay if they need to be weighed
- If any of these Waka weigh less than 14kg this will be noted and the Regional W1 coordinator for that paddler will be called for
- The Waka will be reweighed and verified by regional coordinator - if the waka is less than 14kg they will be disqualified and the results will be updated to reflect the disqualification
- Weighing for the first three across the line will be done for all races from Heats to Finals.

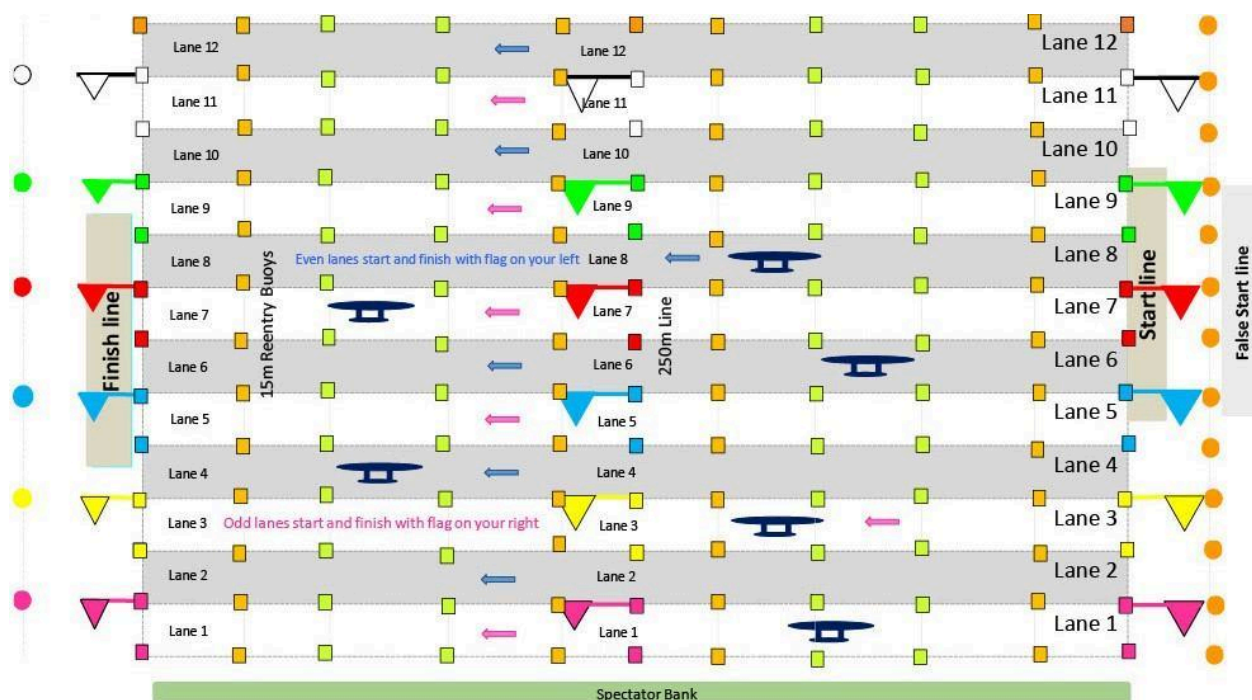
On W1 day, the loading bay bank will be marked out for each region. Regional coordinators are expected to monitor this space and ensure access ways are not blocked. Paddlers are responsible for storing W1 in allocated spaces without causing damage to any other waka.

PICK UP / COLLECTION OF W1 WAKA - Wednesday and Thursday, end of day

As above, ALL W1 waka finished with on Wednesday are to be Checked, Cleaned, and **removed from the Loading Bay**. Access will be from 3pm. After the Regional W1 250m Dash on Thursday, the rest of the W1 waka are to be Checked, Cleaned, and **removed from the Loading Bay**.

RACE STARTS

Every race will approach the false start line and start line the same.

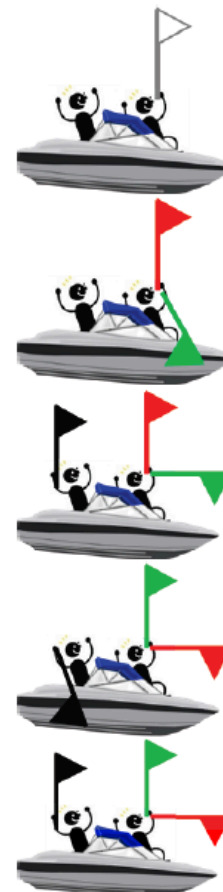
The **WHITE FLAG** will be used to signal to the Waka they are to proceed to the false start line.

Once the Waka are aligned on the false start line the **RED FLAG** will be raised to proceed to the start line.

If during this time at least the bow of one waka is over the start line – the **BLACK FLAG** will be raised. (This allows for waka to correct themselves if they find they are over the start line).

If the waka are corrected the **BLACK FLAG** will be lowered and the **GREEN FLAG** will start the race.

If after a reasonable amount of time the waka have not been corrected the **BLACK FLAG** will remain raised and the **GREEN FLAG** will then start the race.



- If the **BLACK FLAG** is lowered when the **GREEN FLAG** is raised - *No teams will be disqualified for START LINE FAULTS*
- If the **BLACK FLAG** is raised and then remains risen as the race starts – *There will be at least one team disqualified for a START LINE FAULT*

Preparation for starts is key. Small factors can make a huge difference, such as:

- Ensuring your crew can distinguish the false start line from the start line
- Watching a few races start before your own (particularly the Steerer)
- Taking into considerations conditions on the day and how this will affect the start
- The Steerer assessing what impact the wind is having on the waka before reaching the false start line, to determine the angle of their approach

KAITŪAO



We have a dedicated team of kaitūao (volunteers) for the entire week. We are very grateful for all those who have offered their time to volunteer during the week - **KA NUI TE MIHI!**

Please respect and follow their instructions at all times, and at the different areas of the event.

We kindly ask all regions to assist at the end of each day to remove the Waka from the water. Many hands make for light work, and an announcement will be made calling for your assistance each day.

UNIFORMS - TOPS - UPDATED RACE RULE

As notified in Pānui 2, and as per the [2023 updated race rules](#) (race rule 11), uniform tops will now be defined by the following three categories:

Category	Example of the category cut
<p>Category one:</p> <p>Singlet (<i>any cut of singlet as long as artwork and, colour and design are the same</i>)</p>	 <p>Paddlers can wear either singlet in one team as long as the artwork and, colour and design are the same</p>
<p>Category two:</p> <p>Short Sleeve (<i>any cut of Short Sleeve as long as artwork and, colour and design are the same</i>)</p>	

Category three:

Long Sleeve (*any cut of Long Sleeve as long as artwork and, colour and design are the same*)



- Teams must wear Club Uniform
- W1 paddlers may wear Club or Region Uniform
- In W6 events a team must be wearing the same category of tops.
- In W12 events, either all 12 paddlers in the same category of tops or two sets of six paddlers each with the same category of tops.
- As per the race rules, **BOTTOMS do not have to be uniform for W6 and W12 teams**

CLUB COORDINATORS

Nearly all Clubs have registered their coordinators for this event - ngā mihi nui! To ensure that urgent messages, correction of entries or any other issue is dealt with urgently. It is important that Event organisers can communicate to Regions and Clubs quickly. This will also prevent delays and/or disappointments. Send details of the club or region: the Coordinator's Name, email address and mobile number to event@wakaama.co.nz - subject heading Club COORDINATOR.

You can have 2 co-ordinators e.g. one junior, one senior; and/or some clubs are so big they will need more than one person to share the load over the week. We will issue you with a club co-ordinators pass.

VENDORS

We have over 60 vendors and promoters who are going to be onsite for the week, plus some of the Cambridge businesses are offering discounts to the waka ama whanau. Please support them!

HEALTHY KAI

With the support of our vendors and whanau, we are continuing to follow this kaupapa to be a healthier event. There will be no fizzy drinks or deep fried food available to purchase onsite. Water stations are available onsite to re-fill your bottles during the week.

Finally..... most of the Waka Ama NZ staff will be onsite at the Lake setting up from Friday 12th January. So please do not expect prompt responses to emails. **For matters of an urgent nature please call Aroha on 021809845 or Lara on 0275484612. Otherwise, the Admin desk will be open at the lake in the Don Rowlands Centre from 2:00 pm- 7:30 pm on Saturday 11th January**

INVASIVE SPECIES MANAGEMENT

As kaitiaki of our roto and awa, we are emphasising the importance of following the new Check Clean Dry steps for our Waka Ama whānau to ensure we do not spread the invasive clam or any other species in our lakes and rivers. For more information, please visit the [Ministry for Primary Industries website](#)

All hoe, life jackets/PFDs, clothing and footwear will need to be **Checked** and washed **Clean** of any visible debris before leaving Lake Karāpiro. On return to your whare, you will also need to follow the Clean and Dry instructions for your clothes, lifejackets, water shoes, and hats.

There will be dedicated wash stations set up for W1 and W6 waka, ama and kiato in the loading bay area - **ALL W1 waka will need to be Cleaned, and stickered BEFORE leaving the loading bay.** Please do your part, follow the instructions of the Kaitiāo, and wait patiently for your turn.

PICK UP / COLLECTION OF W1

WAKA - Wednesday and Thursday, end of day

To clear the area, and monitor the waka washing, we please ask that **ALL W1 waka** finished with on Wednesday are Checked, washed Clean, and **removed from the Loading Bay at the end of the day.** Access will be granted from 3pm. After the Regional W1 250m Dash on Thursday, we ask again please for **ALL W1 waka** to be Checked, washed Clean, and **removed from the Loading Bay.** Access will be from 3pm.



FRESHWATER GOLD CLAM INFO SHEET WAKA AMA

As kaitiaki of our roto and awa we are emphasising the importance of following the new Check Clean Dry steps for our Waka Ama whānau to ensure we do not spread gold clams or any other invasive species in our waterways.

Before you move

- from Lake Maraetai (Mangakino) to anywhere upstream; OR
- from any part of the Waikato River and lakes to any other lake, river or estuary; OR
- between any lake, river or estuary in the North Island; OR
- when going from the North Island to the South Island

CHECK - for what is visible

- CHECK and flick off any visible matter like weed, mud or adult clams at the site.

CLEAN - for what is not visible

- Blast your waka inside and out with tap water, including the ama and kiato, beside the waterway or at home - NOT into a stormwater drain.
- Be sure to wash out any nooks and crevices.
- Then drain it, including removing the bungs.
- Use one of the treatments (below) for absorbent materials that have been in the river or lake water and can stay wet longer - lifejackets, canvas sprayskirts, removable seats, dry bags, booties, straps/ratchets and ropes.

TREATMENTS:

1. Soak in hot tap water (above 55°C for at least 5 minutes); or
2. Soak in diluted household bleach (10%, or 1 to 10 ratio) for an hour; or
3. Freeze until solid (overnight)

DRY - to be sure

- DRY areas inside the waka where water has pooled with an old towel.
- Then leave to dry inside and out.
- Leave waka and gear to completely dry for 2 days.
