EVENT DETAILS

Classes: W1, W6, W12

Course: 500m straight course for W1, W6 and W12 500m
250m course for turn races - W6 1000m and 1500m events
250m Course for Regional W1 Dash
Half lanes for all straight races

Categories: **Men and Women only**

The Taitamariki boys and Adaptive Men's W6 divisions are permitted to have mixed-gender crews.

Canoes: W6/W12 – Moana Nui Mahi Mahi

W1 - Any type, rudderless, weighted up to a minimum weight of **14kgs (Including ama and kiato)**

International Competitors: International teams may be invited at the Race Directors' discretion.
International teams will only be allowed to race in an outside lane and will not medal.

EVENT ELIGIBILITY

- **Only clubs recognised as financial and constitutional members of Waka Ama NZ are eligible to enter.**
- All paddlers must have a current Waka Ama NZ ID card, which is needed at the event.
- Non-medalling International teams are by invitation from Waka Ama NZ only.
- **Each paddler can only race in one age group/division per event. (For the definition of “event” 1000m and 1500m are defined at the same event.)**
- This rule applies to W1 Categories also.

International Eligibility (as per the race rules):

21 – Eligibility

21.1 Residency: To be eligible to compete at a National Championship, competitors must be a New Zealand citizen, or have been a continuous resident in New Zealand for a minimum of three (3) months prior to the event, or be from a country from Domestic Status; namely Cook Islands, Niue and Tokelau.

ONLINE MANAGERS' MEETING - NEW

For 2026, the Managers' Meeting for all race days will be held on Thursday January 8th at 7pm via ZOOM. It is compulsory for all Club and Area Coordinators to attend this session, and any additional Team Managers/coaches are welcome to attend too. Links for the meeting will be sent to those who have registered as a Club/Regional Coordinator as above.

ONLINE ENTRIES - Close Sunday 14th December 2025

- Club reps will register W6 and W12 entries.
- Regional Reps will need to register W1, Adaptive entries, and combined club W12 entries
- Regional Reps will need to register Premier Men/Women Regional W1 and W12 entries

REMEMBER - to please check all your club entries before 13 December to avoid paying late fees for any changes made after this date.

RACE RULES

The amended race rules can be found here: [Waka Ama NZ Race Rules](#). This link includes a separate document that explains any race rule amendments

A reminder about the club uniform rule (Race rule #11), uniform tops are now defined by the following three categories:

Category	Example of the category cut
Category one: <i>Singlet (any cut of singlet as long as artwork and, colour and design are the same)</i> Paddlers can wear either singlet in one team as long as the artwork and, colour and design are the same	
Category two: <i>Short Sleeve (any cut of Short Sleeve as long as artwork and, colour and design are the same)</i>	
Category three: <i>Long Sleeve (any cut of Long Sleeve as long as artwork and, colour and design are the same)</i>	

- Teams must wear Club Uniform
- W1 paddlers may wear Club or Region Uniform
- In W6 events a team must be wearing the same category of tops.
- In W12 events, either all 12 paddlers in the same category of tops or two sets of six paddlers each with the same category of tops.
- As per the race rules, **BOTTOMS do not have to be uniform for W6 and W12 teams**

Entry Fees are invoiced per paddler by age, no matter how many events they compete in. Entry Fees are non-refundable. If a paddler is withdrawn their fee may be transferred to a replacement paddler. Any outstanding amount must be paid prior to racing. Fees are only applicable to this National Club Sprint event and may not be carried over.

*For **Adaptive W6 only** the fee is \$35.00. This relates to Adaptive W6 and anyone else in that crew that is only racing in that event. If paddlers are doing **both** Adaptive W6, and any other event including Adaptive W1, and/or W12/W6/W1 racing for the club or region - the full entry fee will apply.

Paddlers only pay the entry fee of the age category they are currently in. **'Age is taken as reaching the specified age in the year of competition'**.

REGATTA YEAR minus YEAR OF BIRTH = RACE AGE, eg 2026 minus 2010 = 16

NB. If you are turning 17 in 2026 you are a J19 paddler – Not a J16 paddler.

As per the race rules, paddlers compete in divisions based on their age. Age is taken as reaching a specified age in the year of competition (year of competition is from 1 January to 31 December).

W12 COMBINED CREWS

In principle, National Championships are club-based events. As a result, W6 crews shall be made up of competitors from one club. However, W12 crews can be made up of competitors from up to two clubs from the **same region** in any of the following divisions:

- Taitamariki
- Intermediate
- Senior Master
- Golden Master
- Master 70
- Master 75

This rule **only applies** where a club does not have sufficient paddlers to form their own, stand-alone, W12 crews in those age categories.

A W12 crew made up of 2 clubs may be a combination of any number of paddlers from those two clubs. They must satisfy all other rules as specified in the [Race Rules](#). These crews will need to be entered online by the region, including paddler names.

MASTER 70, MASTER 75 & MASTER 80 - TIME PENALTIES

Master 70, Master 75 and Master 80 (men and women) teams will receive time penalties of 10 seconds per infraction in the heats, which may allow them to progress instead of being disqualified automatically. In the semi-finals and finals, regular disqualifications for infractions will apply.

TAITAMARIKI RACING - Sunday 11th & Monday 12th January

All Taitamariki racing will be held on a 250m course. The following events will be held for Taitamariki:

- W6 250m
- W12 250m

Taitamariki racing will progress from heats to Championship, Cup, Plate and Bowl divisions. With a final being held in each division. All teams that entered the heats will progress to either the Championship, Cup, Plate or Bowl division.

Note: Championship Finals will be acknowledged with medals. Cup, Plate and Bowl finals will be acknowledged by ribbons

INTERMEDIATE RACING - Monday 12th & Tuesday 13th January

The following events will be held for Intermediates:

- W6 500m
- W6 500m (1 turn)
- W12 500m
- W1 500m - **the W1 events will be held on Wednesday January 14th**

Intermediate teams will receive time penalties for infractions in the heats, which may allow them to progress instead of being disqualified automatically. In Semi-Finals and Finals regular infractions will remain.

ADAPTIVE W6 RACING - Friday 16th January - CHANGE OF DAY

The following events will be held for Regional or Club based Adaptive W6 Crews:

- W6 500m
- W6 500m (1 turn)

Each team must be made up of a minimum of 3 adaptive paddlers. Where possible clubs/regions should try to make up teams full of adaptive paddlers.

Teams can represent a Club or a Region. If you have adaptive paddlers in your club or region that may wish to take up this opportunity, please inform them.

ADAPTIVE W1 RACING - Wednesday 14th January

Adaptive W1 racing will take place on the same day as the J19/Adult W1 events.

To comply with the International Va'a Rules, adaptive races will be run by the classifications (VL1, VL1A, VL2, VL3, VL4). If you are unsure if you are classified, or do not know your classification, please contact events@wakaama.co.nz. Please submit all club entries to your region representatives to be entered. All adaptive paddlers must be affiliated to a WANZ affiliated club.

REGIONAL W1 250m DASH - Thursday 15th January

Please note: As in 2025 this race will be run on Thursday the same day as the Regional W12.

Each region can enter 2 paddlers in each category. There will be one race for each category:

- 1 race for Open Men (2 paddlers per region)
- 1 race for Open Women (2 paddlers per region)
- 1 race for J19 Men (2 paddlers per region)
- 1 race for J19 women (2 paddlers per region)
- Straight finals
- The lanes will be split, to enable 12 paddlers to compete in one race.
- Medals will be awarded for each event

REGIONAL W12 - Thursday 15th January

This prestigious race is a straight out battle of the regions. Each region can enter 1 team in each category

- 1 x Regional Men's W12 race
- 1 x Regional Women's W12 race
- Straight final
- Medals will be awarded for each event
- The team can be made up of any age paddlers (14+ upwards) from that region.
- The region can choose how the paddlers are selected to form the fastest W12 crew that the region can muster!

TAITAMARIKI AND INTERMEDIATE LIFEJACKETS

It is compulsory for Taitamariki & Intermediate paddlers to wear Maritime NZ approved PFDs/life jackets, while competing at the 2026 Sprint Nationals.

As in previous years, **inflatable PFD/life jackets are prohibited** for our Taitamariki and Intermediates, as generally these jackets are made for adult sizes only once inflated. The safety of our Taitamariki and Intermediates is of the utmost importance.

ID CARDS

Cost is \$7.00 (for new and replacement cards)**

- All paddlers must have a bar-coded ID card to be able to race.
- For new or replacement cards: Club reps must complete an application online using their login & password. Before you create a new ID, please search the database for the paddler you are registering in case they already have an ID number.

ID CARD TIP: To avoid the last-minute rush for club administrators you should start to collect new paddler verification documents and photos now, and do a few each week. It will save you a lot of work the week prior to Christmas when everyone is hectic or away and not able to access documents! And it will help our office immensely!

W1 WEIGHING PROCESS

IMPORTANT – PLEASE SHARE THIS INFORMATION WITH ALL W1 PADDLERS AND MANAGERS

- **W1 Waka must all weigh a minimum of 14kgs (fully rigged)**
- We will not be weighing all W1 waka prior to the racing
- The first 3 Waka in each race will be weighed as they come off the water at the end of their race.
- Paddlers are responsible for ensuring that their waka has weights in it when they race, if it needs weighing up
- **It is the paddler's responsibility to ensure that the waka weighs 14kg when they race.**
- The scales will be set up prior to races during the W1 drop off times. Paddlers are encouraged to weigh their waka on the official scales to check its weight prior to racing, if in doubt.

W1 Drop off times: 4pm - 7pm - Tuesday January 13th
6am - 7am - Wednesday January 14th

- There is no restriction to the amount or type of W1 that can be used for this event.
- W1 must only be dropped off at the allocated times above
- Drop off access is via Gate 1
- Hull, Ama and Kiato will be weighed and must weigh a minimum of 14kgs
- Space will be marked by region. Please check in with your regional coordinator for your area
- Your W1 is your responsibility.
- Bring your own bungs for your waka and look after them.
- A limited supply of number holders will be onsite and can be purchased from the admin building for \$6 each. Please bring your own duct tape.
- Number Holders can be ordered online for \$6 - <https://waka-ama-nz-shop.myshopify.com/>
- There will be access to the race course for W1s **AFTER** the prizegiving on Tuesday 16th – **there will be no lake access on Wednesday morning.**

On W1 day, the loading bay bank will be marked out for each region. Regional coordinators are expected to monitor this space and ensure access ways are not blocked. Paddlers are responsible for storing W1 in allocated spaces without causing damage to any other waka.

W1 Waka Pick Up/Collection - All W1 waka not required for the Regional W1 250m events on Thursday, must be removed from Loading Bay after racing on Wednesday. First access will be granted from 3pm. Then on Thursday after the Regional W1 event, the rest of the W1 waka must also be uplifted from Loading Bay to clear the space. Access will be granted from 3pm.

ALL W1 WAKA MUST BE WASHED DOWN AND STICKERED BEFORE THEY CAN LEAVE THE LOADING BAY. PLEASE BE PATIENT AND FOLLOW TH INSTRUCTIONS FROM THE KAITŪAO

W1 ENTRIES AND QUOTA

Entry Fees:

If you are entering W1 only the full fee is payable for your age category. There is no extra fee for entering the W1 events if you are also paddling W6/W12 for your club/region.

Quota:

To manage the W1 events it is necessary to limit entries. Therefore, a set number of heats for each category have been confirmed. Regions are allocated 4 entries for each race division, plus an extra quota for having finalists in the previous year's Nationals. See the next page for the 2026 W1 Quotas.

Should a region's quota be unfilled, paddlers on the waitlist in their region will get the first option to take up a spot. Should the region have no waitlisted paddlers, then all other waitlisted paddlers in that category across other regions will be ranked by waitlisting and then randomly drawn for available space.

Please note: Whilst there is a regional quota for W1, paddlers are representing their club within that region. Paddlers may only paddle for 1 club at the national championship. W1 racing contributes toward the club points for the Club Points Trophy

ACCOMMODATION

PARKING – WEEK-LONG PASSES

Car parking will be free for the first day of racing (Sunday 11th January). From Monday onwards, parking will be \$5 per vehicle, per day.

Week-long Parking passes are available to pre-purchase for \$25. Week-long passes must be displayed on the vehicle dashboard for clear viewing and must include the vehicle registration number. Passes will be available for purchase from the admin desk at the Don Rowlands Centre, and online from October 20th at the Waka Ama Online Shop <https://waka-ama-nz-shop.myshopify.com/> (until January 10th).

The last chance to purchase a week-long pass will be directly from the Admin area on Sunday January 11th. Parking passes will not be available for purchase after Sunday. Daily charges will incur as you enter through the gate.

BIOSECURITY INFORMATION

As kaitiaki of our roto and awa we will continue to follow the **Check, Clean, Dry** steps for our Waka Ama events, to ensure we do not spread the freshwater clams or any other invasive species in our waterways. For more information on the clam, please visit the [Ministry for Primary Industries website](#)

All waka, hoe, life jackets/PFDs, clothing and footwear will need to be checked before leaving Lake Karāpiro. There will be high pressure wash stations set up for all W1 and W6 waka, ama and kiato in the loading bay area - **ALL waka must be washed, before they will be released from the area.** Please do your part and follow the instructions of the Kaitiāao. In addition, there will again be special dunking bins for life jackets/PFDs, clothing, and footwear along the exit pathway, after each race. Please follow the instructions of the Kaitiāao situated at that station.



FRESHWATER GOLD CLAM INFO SHEET WAKA AMA

As kaitiaki of our roto and awa we are emphasising the importance of following the new Check Clean Dry steps for our Waka Ama whānau to ensure we do not spread gold clams or any other invasive species in our waterways.

Before you move

- from Lake Maraetai (Mangakino) to anywhere upstream; OR
- from any part of the Waikato River and lakes to any other lake, river or estuary; OR
- between any lake, river or estuary in the North Island; OR
- when going from the North Island to the South Island

CHECK - for what is visible

- CHECK and flick off any visible matter like weed, mud or adult clams at the site.

CLEAN - for what is not visible

- Blast your waka inside and out with tap water, including the ama and kiato, beside the waterway or at home - NOT into a stormwater drain.
- Be sure to wash out any nooks and crevices.
- Then drain it, including removing the bungs.
- Use one of the treatments (below) for absorbent materials that have been in the river or lake water and can stay wet longer - lifejackets, canvas sprayskirts, removable seats, dry bags, booties, straps/ratchets and ropes.

TREATMENTS:

1. Soak in hot tap water (above 55°C for at least 5 minutes); or
2. Soak in diluted household bleach (10%, or 1 to 10 ratio) for an hour; or
3. Freeze until solid (overnight)

DRY - to be sure

- DRY areas inside the waka where water has pooled with an old towel.
- Then leave to dry inside and out.
- Leave waka and gear to completely dry for 2 days.
